Genealogies of Orientalism Jul 30 2020 Orientalism, as explored by Edward Said in 1978, was a far more complex phenomenon than many suspected, being homogenous along the lines of neither culture nor time.

Indeed, it is deeply embedded in the collective reimaginings that were?and are?nationalism. The dozen essays in *Genealogies of Orientalism* argue that the critique of orientalism, far from being exhausted, must develop further. To do so, however, a historical turn must be made, and the ways in which modernity itself is theorized and historicized must be rethought. According to Joan W. Scott, author of *The Politics of the Veil*, the essays in this collection "develop a remarkable perspective on Edward Said's Orientalism, placing it in a long historical context of critiques of colonial representations, and deepening our understanding of the very meaning of modernity." He was a member of the Council for Aboriginal Affairs and, in 1968, he was the ABC's Boyer Lecturer. He was a founding member of the Aboriginal Treaty Committee. He was appointed to the chair of anthropology at the Australian National University and served as head of the department of anthropology and sociology until his retirement in 1970. He died in 1981. World of the Gift Sep 12 2021 The anthropologist Marcel Mauss, in his famous exploration of the gift in "primitive" and archaic societies, showed that the essential aspect of the exchange of presents involved the establishment of a social tie that bound the parties together above and beyond any material value of the objects exchanged. He argued that these intangible mutual "debts" constituted the social fabric. Godbout and Caillé show that, contrary to the modern assumption that societies function on the basis of market exchange and the pursuit of self-interest, the gift still constitutes the foundation of our social fabric. The authors describe the gift not as an object but as a social connection, perhaps the most important social connection because it creates a sense of obligation to respond in kind. They examine the gift in a broad range of cases such as blood and organ donation; volunteer work; the bonds between friends, couples, and family; Santa Claus; the interaction between performers and their audience; and the relation of the artist to society. Housing First Jan 04 2021 Housing First guides organizations through the implementation of the evidence-based Pathways model to end homelessness and teaches how to apply it in ongoing work with those who have co-occurring severe mental health and substance use disorders. Developed by Pathways to Housing National, this internationally adopted model advocates providing housing first, followed by other services for homeless people with co-occurring disorders: team-based psychiatric, addiction, and employment counseling. This manual details the principles of the "Housing First" approach, using case examples and a checklist to ensure fidelity of implementation and day-to-day practice. It shows how the operations of Housing First embody the program's philosophy, offering tools for assembling and managing the two commonly used models of support service teams; securing property and engaging landlords; assisting clients in setting up their apartments; and incorporating other evidence-based programs, such as integrated dual disorders treatment (IDDT) and

#### Supported Employment.

*Virtual Ethnography* Aug 11 2021 Cutting through the exaggerated and fanciful beliefs about the new possibilities of 'net life', Hine produces a distinctive understanding of the significance of the Internet and addresses such questions as: what challenges do the new technologies of communication pose for research methods? Does the Internet force us to rethink traditional categories of 'culture' and 'society'? In this compelling and thoughtful book, Hine shows that the Internet is both a site for cultural formations and a cultural artefact which is shaped by people's understandings and expectations. The Internet requires a new form of ethnography. The author considers the shape of this new ethnography and guides readers through its application in multiple settings.

*Managing* Feb 17 2022 A half century ago Peter Drucker put management on the map. Leadership has since pushed it off. Henry Mintzberg aims to restore management to its proper place: front and center. "We should be seeing managers as leaders." Mintzberg writes, "and leadership as management practiced well." How can you manage it when you can't reliably measure it? This book is vintage Mintzberg: iconoclastic, irreverent, carefully researched, myth-breaking. *A History of Sociological Research Methods in America, 1920-1960* Apr 26 2020 This is the first book on the general history of US sociological research. It provides systematic archival, documentary, and interview data which question conventional views on research methods, developing our understanding of both the history of social thought, and the settings in which social research is produced.

*Kinship, Law and the Unexpected* Dec 23 2019 Examines Euro-American kinship as the kinship of a specifically knowledge-based society.

*Defending Qualitative Research* Nov 02 2020 Focussing on the phases of qualitative research which precede and follow fieldwork - design, analysis, and textualization - this book offers new theoretical tools to tackle one of the most common criticisms advanced against qualitative research: its presumed lack of rigour. Rejecting the notion of "rigour" as formulated in quantitative research and based on the theory of probability, it proposes a theoretical frame that allows combining the goals of rigour and that of creativity through the reference to theory of argumentation. As such, it will appeal to scholars and students across the social sciences with interests in qualitative research methods.

*Knowing in Organizations: A Practice-Based Approach* Jul 10 2021 This work explores the relationship among knowing, learning, and practice in the development of organizational knowledge. It explores the implications for intervention growing out of the notion that organizational knowledge cannot be conceived as a mental process residing in members' heads.

*The Conservatory of Santa Teresa* Mar 26 2020 This volume is the first translation of Romano Bilenchi's 1940 masterpiece to appear in English. This is surprising since *The Conservatory of Santa Teresa* is much more than an invaluable historical document of life in provincial Tuscany around the time of the First World War. It is truly one of the most important works of fiction published in Italy under Fascism. In telling of the pre-adolescent Sergio's encounter with the larger world of sex, politics, and the violence and cruelty of adult life, Bilenchi succeeds in representing a universal paradigm, that of the clash of innocence with experience. But what makes Sergio's trajectory unique is that he goes through it in the company of three extraordinary women who are at once femmes fatales and benevolent guides: his mother, his aunt, and his tutor, all almost unbearably beautiful, as least in Sergio's eyes. These women, plus the dazzling landscape of the Siemese countryside as captured by Bilenchi, make Sergio's journey an enviable even if sometimes painful and bewildering experience.

*The Social Production of Indifference* Sep 19 2019 In this fascinating book, Michael Herzfeld argues that 'modern' bureaucratically regulated societies are no more 'rational' or less 'symbolic' than the societies traditionally studied by anthropologists. Drawing primarily on the example of modern Greece and utilizing other European materials, he suggests that we cannot understand national bureaucracies divorced from local-level ideas about chance, personal character, social relationships and responsibility. He points out that both formal regulations and day-to-day bureaucratic practices rely heavily on the symbols and language of the moral boundaries between insiders and outsiders; a ready means of expressing prejudice and of justifying neglect. It therefore happens that societies with proud traditions of generous hospitality may paradoxically produce at the official level some of the most calculated indifference one can find anywhere.

*Le figlie delle catastrofi* Apr 07 2021 Che adulti diventano i bambini cresciuti in tempo di catastrofe e ricostruzione? Quali effetti hanno sia il periodo di sofferenza, sia le strategie di salvataggio e sostegno sociale che le società locali mettono in opera per loro? Seguendo le vite di bambine e adolescenti cresciute in Aceh (Indonesia) dopo il terribile tsunami del 2004, alla fine di una lunga guerra civile (1975-2005), questo libro esamina il costituirsi intimo della marginalità sociale attraverso le ideologie e le pratiche di ricostruzione designate a scongiurarla. La povertà economica, la discriminazione di genere, il commercio del corpo sessuale e lo sfruttamento lavorativo di alcune giovani acehnesi appaiono infatti non solo inevitabili, ma proprio strutturali al contesto di distruzione e di riprogettazione sociale nel quale crescono le ragazze. Non si tratta tuttavia di un'etnografia della disperazione. Il libro, forte di una ricerca decennale, presenta persone capaci di reinterpretare strutture tradizionali e capovolgimenti contemporanei con creatività. Come fanno?, ci si chiede. La riflessione sullo sviluppo di una personalità vitale conduce alla definizione di un "sé mobile", capace di svicolare fra le matrici simboliche trasformative di catastrofe e ricostruzione senza perdersi e senza rinunciare a compiere buone scelte.

*Waterworlds* Jun 28 2020 In one form or another, water participates in the making and unmaking of people's lives, practices, and stories. Contributors' detailed ethnographic work analyzes the union and mutual shaping of water and social lives. This volume discusses current ecological disturbances and engages in a world where unbounded relationalities and unsettled frames of orientation mark the lives of all, anthropologists included. Water emerges as a fluid object in more senses than one, challenging anthropologists to foreground the mutable character of their objects of study and to responsibly engage with the generative role of cultural analysis.
